

## Irish exporters express Brexit fears

In just under two weeks, the people of the UK will vote on whether or not they want to remain part of the European Union.

Ireland's campaign has intensified with the announcement that Taoiseach Enda Kenny is to meet UK Prime Minister David Cameron in Manchester in the coming week.

Speaking recently, Kenny said a Brexit would likely have an adverse impact on trade between the two countries.

Simon McKeever of the Irish Exporters Association has said he is extremely concerned.

“Far be it from one country to interfere in the matters of another, but this really matters to us,” said Keever.

“We have a huge amount of skin in this game - 15% of our exports go to the UK, 20% of our services exports, 44% of our indigenous exports.

“Does this matter? It matters a huge amount”
